Dear friends,

A few weeks ago I spent time on retreat with the Darlington District Superintendents' at Ampleforth, a Benedictine Abbey. This ancient tradition is known particularly for the way in which it shapes the day around common times of prayer and worship – what is known as the Liturgy of the Hours. The Benedictine tradition reminds us that whilst Sunday, as the Lord's day, is a particular time for gathering and celebration, and whilst there are festivals which focus our attention upon different aspects of God's story, worship is about the whole of life and not just part of it. In the Benedictine tradition there is no divide between sacred and secular: the worlds of prayer, work and community intermingle. It is also a reminder that worship and prayer are disciplines which we live out so that God can be more fully present to us and we to God and our neighbour. Even the word used to describe this, liturgy, is derived from Greek words meaning the 'people's work'.

Although the Benedictine tradition has had a huge influence upon the shape of Western worship, it does seem very far from most of our own experiences of worship even whilst it is wonderful to sit in prayer at the Abbey allowing the worship simply to wash over you. Nevertheless, whilst we may have own preferences in worship, there is something important here which resonates with the Methodist tradition. Take, for example, the theme of the Superintendents' retreat: a *Methodist Way of Life*. A *Methodist Way of Life* is not a way of suggesting that Methodist Christians are in some way different or better than other Christians. Rather it is a reminder that our roots lie in a disciplined approach to holiness and in discovering rhythms and patterns of Christian living which help us to walk more closely in the steps of Jesus in the power of the Spirit. A *Methodist Way of Life* is a way of holding ourselves accountable alongside others, recognising that although sometimes we will fail, discovering a rhythm of discipleship is essential to a living lives of grace.

What does a *Methodist Way of Life* say about worship? It reads as follows:

As far as we are able:

- We will pray daily
- We will worship with others regularly
- We will look and listen for God in Scripture and the world.

There are, of course, other aspects of a *Methodist Way of Life* (learning and caring; service; evangelism). But there is a challenge here for all of us to discover afresh what it might mean to live a life with worship at its heart 24/7. Over to you!
